Brief Report on Capacity Building Training on Research Methods and Ethics

A highly successful three-day capacity-building training on Research Methods and Ethics took place from *June 26th to 28th*, *2024*, at the OSSREA Hall in Addis Ababa, Ethiopia. The training was organized by the Behind the Scenes Ethiopia project in collaboration with the International Center for Research on Women (ICRW) and was financially supported by the Mastercard Foundation. The primary objective of this training was to equip youth researchers with essential skills and knowledge in research methods and ethics for the Behind the Scenes-Ethiopia Project. The training aimed to provide participants with a comprehensive understanding of qualitative and quantitative research methods, with a particular emphasis on feminist methodology and data analysis. Additionally, the training explored research methods from creative arts perspectives, offering a unique approach to research. Moreover, the training underscored the importance of research ethics in the social sciences and humanities fields, ensuring that participants are well-versed in ethical considerations when conducting research.

About twelve individuals, including four males, from the Behind the Scenes Ethiopia project, (youth researchers and project staff) participated in the capacity-building training. The training sessions were conducted by four university professors from Addis Ababa University, namely Dr. Selam Esayas, Dr. Mesele Mengisteab, Dr. Zena Berhanu, and Dr. Ezana Amdework.



The capacity-building training commenced with a warm welcome and introduction by Mr. Garedew Yilma, the project coordinator of the Behind the Scenes Ethiopia. He extended a warm welcome to all participants, introduced the training program scheduled for three days. Following this, Professor Genet Tadele, Principal Investigator of the Behind the Scenes Ethiopia project, welcomed the attendees and expressed his sincere gratitude. He mentioned that this training on research methods and ethics is a crucial component of the project aimed at enhancing the capacity of youth researchers in research methods, specifically focusing on feminist methodology, the creative sector, and research ethics. He emphasized that although some topics covered in the training may seem repetitive to some participants, they should be considered as refresher training and are important for active participation. Professor Tadele highlighted that the training topics are directly related to the Behind the Scenes project and are essential for the success of the project research work. He encouraged trainees to raise and discuss various issues and questions related to feminist methods, quantitative methods, creative arts, and research ethics within an Ethiopian context. Prof. Getnet expressed his heartfelt appreciation to the resource persons for their dedication and expertise in delivering the training. Additionally, he acknowledged those who contributed significantly to making the training possible and wished for fruitful deliberations as he officially opened the training session.



Various training topics were covered throughout the entire training period. Specifically, on the first day, qualitative research methods were explored with a particular emphasis on feminist methodology, including understanding key concepts, feminism as a movement and theory, feminist methodology, and its application to research, and feminist analysis. The second day

provided an overview of research methods from creative arts perspectives, delving into the brief historical backdrop of artistic research, the basic formula of artistic research, methods, strategies, and methodology in artistic research, as well as narrative, power, and the public in artistic research. Additionally, research ethics in the social sciences and humanities field were discussed, covering basic ethical principles, ethical considerations for researchers in the social sciences, and ethical dilemmas in social research. Finally, the third day focused on quantitative research methods with a particular emphasis on data analysis, including basics of data types and levels of measurement, getting started with SPSS, data management and preparation, descriptive statistics, exploring relationships between variables, inferential statistics, and regression analysis.



The training was engaging and lively due to the sincere interest shown by participants in the subject matter. To achieve the training's objectives, various training methodologies were employed by the trainers, such as scenario illustration, group work, question and answer sessions, case presentations, and practical exercises using SPSS software with quantitative data. Furthermore, the training provided an opportunity for networking among the trainees to get to know each other better.

In conclusion, Eyerusalem Kassahun, the Country PI of the Behind the Scenes Ethiopia project, expressed gratitude to all participants for attending the capacity-building training and to the trainers for successfully delivering the sessions. Eyerusalem emphasized the importance of applying the knowledge and skills acquired during the training to the Behind the Scenes research project. Additionally, she highlighted the next tasks of the research activities and

reminded the youth researchers to submit the individual tasks assigned to each and to begin working on the systematic review of the mapping. Finally, she extended her thanks to the International Center for Research on Women (ICRW) and the Mastercard Foundation for their financial support.
